backroads of Pisgah National Forest
and arrived at Wolf Ford Horse Camp

With supervision, Lincoln helped grill hamburgers and hotdogs over the fire, while PB&Js were available for anyone who preferred them. The Explorers enjoyed the hands-on experience of cooking over a real campfire and refueled for the afternoon ahead, proud of their contributions to the fire.


















Dear Explorers Club Families,
