Traveling east on the Mountain Parkway, take exit 33 at Slade. Follow KY 11 south 1.8 miles to Whittleton Campground on left and trailhead parking area.

Camping and firebuilding in rock shelters is prohibited.



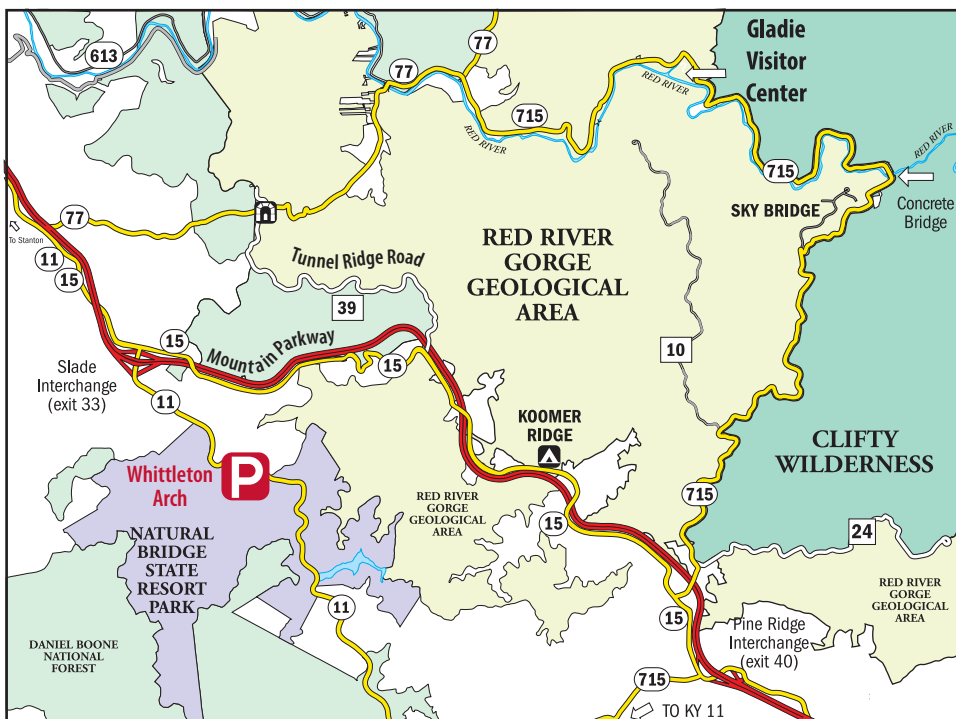
Camp 300 feet AWAY from any road or trail.

Whittleton Arch Trail, located on the Cumberland District, leads to Whittleton Arch. The trail is approximately one mile from Whittleton Campground on the Sheltolee Trace National Recreation Trail #100, Section 14. Whittleton Arch is recorded as the largest arch by mass in the Red River Gorge Geological Area.

Storing Your Food and Trash in Bear Country

Food and trash storage is mandatory, to reduce odors that attract bears. Unless cooking or eating, store your food inside a hardtop vehicle, the trunk of a car or a bear-resistant container. Store your food garbage in the same manner where trash cans are not installed. When camping in the backcountry hang your food at least 10 feet off the ground and four feet away from a tree.
